




SAMITI'S WORK

Pune has been a centre of higher education for over a century. The Vidyarthi Sahayak Samiti, Pune, established in 1955 as a Public trust to support the needy and promising students from rural areas, provides affordable lodging, boarding and guidance for their all rounded development. Along with providing academic atmosphere, the Samiti promotes overall personality development through daily yoga sessions, the Earn and Learn scheme, 4 hours weekly work for Samiti and regular mentor

meetings.

Facilities such as library, reading hall, computer lab, foreign language training, six sigma workshops, sports and basic medical assistance are made available to students. To encourage holistic growth, the Samiti organizes lectures, cultural programmes, group discussions and entrepreneurship guidance. Samiti continues to positively impact the lives of thousands of needy students across the state towards building a better society.

THE TASK OF TRANSFORMING THE YOUTH



Pratap Pawar, Chairman.

I have been associated with the work of Vidyarthi Sahayyak Samiti sine 1975. It's now 50 years. The Founder Dr. Achyutrao Apte said you must accept this responsibility. I didn't have the courage to say 'no' to an idealist and selfless person like him. Many likeminded persons were making efforts to organise lodging and boarding facilities at affordable rates to students coming from rural areas to Pune for higher education and transform them into competent youth. He felt that this work of transforming the youth must be done with the help of the society and that good work is never short of funds. We are experiencing this even today. Lives of thousands of youth from rural areas have been transformed over the last 70 years.

With the spread of education, students from rural areas are joining this stream in large numbers.

And among them, the number of girls is increasing. In order to offer them an opportunity, a new hostel with a capacity of 336 girls has been set up in Pune. For the first time, a new hostel for 60 girls has also been set up outside Pune, at Ahilyanagar. A hostel for 120 boys is also being set up there with financial help from Vinod Jadhav, an entrepreneur from Dubai. With this, it is now possible to offer these facilities to more than 1300 students. While expanding the work like this, Samiti has adopted Salesforce Software to handle the administrative aspects. Vidyarthi Sahayyak Samiti is the first social organization in India to adopt such software.

Most of the boys and girls from Samiti hostels are from agricultural families. We have resolved to induct the concept of entrepreneurship in them when they would search for jobs after finishing higher education. Keeping that in view, lectures of entrepreneurs, visits to some companies and seminars are organized. That is receiving good response from the students.

Helping hands for this noble work are coming forward from within as well as outside the country. Selfless Karyakartas are helping in expanding the work by offering their valuable time. Past students are helping the organization to take this mission forward by offering financial help as also by coming forward to shoulder responsibility. Experts from various fields are associating with Samiti in the task of transformation of the young generation. The society at large has also supported with trust till now. Grateful thanks to all of them. I have the satisfaction that, with the help from all, I could prove that the trust reposed in me by the founders was well placed and that I have been able to accomplish the task put on my shoulders by them. There is no doubt that the future of the generation emerging from the common goal and thoughts is going to be bright.

THE JOY OF WORK

The work of Vidyarthi Sahayyak Samiti is a combination of selflessness, transparency, collective efforts and social awareness. The mission of achieving development of needy and promising students through the combined efforts of many is continuing without break for 70 years. The scope of Samiti's work is ever expanding because of the trust of donors. Seven hostels in Pune accommodate about 1200 students and the two hostels at Ahilyanagar about 180. The share of girls in these is more than 60 %.

Many realized the importance of education in the development of a person. We have generations of such donors extending help for education. Similarly, selfless contribution, selfless voluntary work by Karyakartas and past students play critical role in

Samiti progress. Shri Prataprao Pawar, who has been the Chairman for the last 50 years and who has always been encouraging us to do something new, has given a personal donation of Rs. 5 crore this year showing how a head of the family should be. He encouraged us to organise various programmes aimed at promoting entrepreneurship among students instead of merely turning out students fit for employment, which are showing tremendous response. A glittering function was organized for expressing gratitude towards Shri Prataprao for providing guardianship to several other social organisations as in the case of Samiti. All the organisations jointly presented to him a scroll of honour at the hands of senior scientist Dr. Raghunath Mashelkar. This was not a felicitation of an individual but of values.

The Samiti family always attaches importance to such values. In Samiti also, the students are not merely taught the values of cleanliness, equality, dignity of labour and gratitude, they are visible in their behavior. They are exposed to several ideals in the society. Samiti ex-students surely create an imprint of these values wherever they work. Many past students are returning to Samiti out of a feeling of gratitude. They are shouldering financial responsibility too. I think this a great success of Samiti. » INAUGURATION OF HOSTEL

Samiti's new girls' hostel at Ahilyanagar was inaugurated on 7th July by Dr. Pramod Chaudhary and Parimal Chaudhary. This is the first Samiti hostel outside Pune. It has been constructed from the donation given by Parimal and Pramod Chaudhary Foundation.



» JAWANS AS BROTHERS

With a view to expressing gratitude towards Police and Army Jawans, girls from Samiti tied Rakhis on their hands on 19th August on the occasion of Rakshabandhan under the “Thread of Affection” programme. Rakhis were made by the girls themselves. They tied rakhis on the police personnel of Shivajinagar Police Station and Jawans from the Army hospital, Khadkee. The programme was conducted at the Yerawda Open Jail also.

» MANAGEMENT LESSONS

Most of the management tasks in Samiti hostels are handled by students themselves. A training session was organized on 15-16 June for conducting training in management for the following year. It was attended by about 200 students. » AI AGRO PROJECT

about milk production at the Centre of Excellence for Genetic Improvement in Dairy Farming set up by Rajendra Pawar, Chairman of Baramati Agricultural Development Trust. They also visited the Atal Innovation Centre of the Baramati Agricultural College.

» GATHERING OF DONORS

Construction of the new girls hostel in Pune is now complete and 336 girls can be accommodated in it from this year. A gathering of donors and well wishers who helped in construction of this hostel was organized on 12th July in the new premises. Samiti Chairman Prataprao Pawar, Donor Nitin Karia, Harshal Morde, Permanent Trustee Bhausaheb Jadhav and other donors were present.

» RAKSHABANDHAN

Students who have come from rural areas to Pune for education have memories of their homes. However, going home is not possible. In order to take care of this need, Maji Vidyarthi Mandal organized the celebration of Raksha Bandhan In the hostels.

HOME COMING OF PAST STUDENTS

Past girl students of Samiti had the experience of home coming by recollecting old memories of their days in the hostel . About 100 ex-student girls participated with songs, games, chats and cultural programmes.



» INDEPENDENCE DAY

Flag hoisting ceremonies were held in all the Samiti hostels on Independence Day : by Seema Hoskote, Karyakarta, at Lajpat Bhavan; by Shri Sanjay Amrite at Sumitra Sadan; by Shri Yogesh Deshpande, well known actor, compere, author and director of the movie "Swaragandharva" at Dr. Apte Hostel, where singer actress Apoorva Modak, who played

» SALESFORCE SYSTEM

The software of Salesforce company was introduced in Samiti for management of the admissions process, donations and hostels. Arya Tek were implementation partner for the software. Samiti is the first social organization in India to buy the system from them. The system was procured through the efforts of Samiti Trustee Preeti Rao.

» INTRODUCTION TO SAMITI

Introductory meetings of newly admitted students were held in Dr. Apte Hostel, Lajpat Sankul and Sumitra Sadan. This time, the nature of these meetings was different. After screening of a documentary film on Samiti, Karyakartas asked questions about Samiti and information about Samiti and its rules unfolded from the same. Information about the various schemes of Samiti was also given.

» RENOVATION OF 5 ROOMS

Renovation of 5 rooms of P.D.Karkhanis hostel was carried out from the donation given by Persistent Foundation. The rooms were inaugurated by Smt. Sonali Deshpande, President, Persistent Foundation.

» KNOWLEDGE SESSION

In the knowledge session on the occasion of Ganesh festival, Dr. Mrunal Nerlekar provided guidance on the first day and Shri Milind Deshmukh on the second day. A session on Artificial Intelligence was conducted on 10th September in Dr. Apte hostel. The chief guest Shri Vivek Sawant gave a presentation on the subject of AI and human intelligence.
